Program Overviews:

Each of our Health Sciences certificates is designed to open a door into the healthcare field. Whether you choose one, two, or all three certificate programs, you will gain the skills and experience you need to take the first step - or the next step - in your healthcare career.

EKG Certificate

As an Electrocardiogram (EKG) Technician, you will learn the skills required to administer noninvasive tests to assess the cardiovascular system of your patients. You will study the heart, circulatory system and conduction system, in addition to learning about and working with EKG equipment for proper lead placement and reading of EKG waves.

The EKG program combines academic instruction with practical, hands-on learning where you will complete at least 10 EKG tracings in a laboratory setting.

Phlebotomy Certificate

When you become a phlebotomy technician, or phlebotomist, you become a clinical team member responsible for drawing blood and procuring specimens for diagnostic testing. Safety and infection control, as well as healthcare regulations and quality assurance, will be covered as you learn through a combination of academic instruction and practical application, ending your program with a clinical practicum.

Gerontology Certificate

Studying gerontology will provide you insight into aging, adult development, and care for older adults - the fastest growing patient population in the United States. With elder care making up a significant portion of the US healthcare system, career opportunities in the field of gerontology are expanding. In this program, you will explore healthy aging, social determinants of health and aging pathways, and health disparities and how they impact health equity. The continuum of care, from community dwellings to end of life care decisions will also be covered.
