### Pharmacy Technician Certificate Program

A three-course sequence introduces the student to the role of the technician, pharmacy operations, rules and regulations governing pharmacy practice and basic calculations required for everyday pharmacy practice. The student will work in a pharmacy to complete the required externship. Upon successful completion the student is eligible for state licensure.



### Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Course

The EMT program is designed for those seeking a career in Emergency Medical Services up to the paramedic level. Instruction covers the prompt and efficient delivery of emergency care to the sick and injured. This program conforms to the EMT-B national standard curriculum and is a prerequisite for taking the Massachusetts EMT exam.



### Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) Program

Certified Nursing Assistants provide basic care. They support the nursing staff in hospitals, long-term care facilities and rehabilitation clinics. Upon completion of the three program courses, students will be eligible for certification by the American Red Cross.



### PC Hardware Support Specialist Certificate Program

With BHCC's Accelerated PC Hardware Support Specialist Certificate Program, you'll be prepared for entry-level positions in personal computer hardware support in just two semesters, or eight months! This program prepares you to find employment in information support services departments and other companies specializing in personal computer maintenance support.
