



Congregate Supervisor

This position will serve in a leadership role on a team whose primary focus is to 2 generation stabilization services and house homeless parents and their children. In addition to hiring, supervising and evaluating case managers, the program supervisor works with the Director and other program leadership to ensure successful implementation of agency, state, and program policies and practices and services to current and formerly homeless parents and their children.

The successful candidate will have an, MSW degree with supervisory experience required, LICSW preferred, 5+ years of professional management experience, familiarity working in a clinical setting, bicultural background, experience in managing and leading teams, budgets and diverse funding streams, demonstrated success in applying evidence-based practices including trauma-informed care, critical time intervention and motivational interviewing and experience in homelessness prevention and diversion programming.

With a mission to empower parents facing homelessness to secure and sustain housing and build foundations for their children's futures, FamilyAid is on a fast track to curb the region's growing homelessness crisis. Its nationally recognized homelessness prevention, diversion, emergency shelter, and supportive affordable housing programs serve more than 2,000 children and parents each year.
