Become A Personal Care Attendant (PCA)

The Personal Care Attendant (PCA) program is delivered by MassHealth. MassHealth pays consumeremployers (individuals with physical, intellectual, or developmental disabilities) to hire PCAs to assist with activities of daily living:

- Meal preparation and feeding
- Housekeeping and shopping
- Help with ambulation and transfers
- Support with walking
- Help with toileting
- Help with bathing and dressing

Requirements

- PCAs must be legally able to work in the United States
- PCAs must be able to understand and carry out instructions from the consumeremployer
- PCAs must be 14 years of age or older (some restrictions apply to PCAs under 18 years of age)
- New PCAs must complete a New Hire Orientation training within nine (9) months of their hire date
- See other requirements in MassHealth regulation at 130 CMR 422.000

Career Advancement

On the first day of the second year of employment, PCAs become eligible for:

- College tuition vouchers (eight credits free per year) in credit-bearing or degree programs in the information technology, health care or education fields
- Certified Nurse Aid (CNA) Program includes the course fee, certification test and uniform

Benefits

- Hourly wage of \$17.71
 (This rate reflects a temporary pay increase through 6/30/22)
- Paid family medical leave
- Earn up to 50 hours of paid time off
- Unemployment eligibility
