Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center (BIDMC) is seeking Certified Nursing Assistants, Home Health Aides and direct patient care workers to become Patient Care Technicians (PCT).

BIDMC is offering a program to hire experienced and new graduate direct care workers, train them in the acute care skills needed to be a successful Patient Care Technician (PCT) and place them in full-time jobs on inpatient floors.

Patient Care Technicians work closely with nursing teams to support patients in many ways, from taking their blood pressure to helping a doctor with a physical exam. They observe and report on patients' conditions, check vital signs and assist patients with many tasks that they cannot do for themselves. Nurses and doctors rely on technicians to ensure a safe and quality experience for patients.

PCTs at BIDMC work a regular schedule that generally alternates between two weeks on day shift and two weeks on evening shift or two weeks on evening shift and two weeks on night shift. PCTs also rotate weekends and must be available to work some holidays.

Who is Eligible?

Eligible applicants must:

- Have a computer or phone with Zoom capability

- Have compassion and empathy for others
- Enjoy interacting with patients and families
- Be highly motivated and set high standards for self
- Possess excellent customer service, computer navigation and communication skills
- Have strong attention to detail
- Have the physical ability to lift, transfer and turn patients
- Be available to work rotating shifts that include alternating day/evening shifts every two weeks, alternating evening/night shift every two weeks with rotating weekends and be available to work some holidays

How are participants selected?

Applicants will be asked to fill out an application and take in-person assessments of reading, math and computer skills and attention to detail. Applicants will then be informed if they will be moved forward in the selection process, which consists of a written essay, submission of references and panel Zoom interview.

PCT Training Curriculum

BIDMC's Patient Care Services department has developed a curriculum to teach acute care skills to graduates of direct care programs and individuals with direct care experience. The curriculum is taught by BIDMC staff over three weeks.

Week 1 (24 hours):

- On the first day of training, participants will attend New Employee Orientation from 8:30 a.m.
 4 p.m.
- For the remainder of the week, classroom and skills training will be from 3-7 p.m. both in person and live online

Week 2 (20 hours):

• Classroom and skills training will occur both in person and live online from 3-7 p.m.

Week 3 (40 hours):

- Participants will work full time, 7 a.m. 3:30 p.m.
- Participants will receive hands-on training on an inpatient floor
- After completing three weeks of training, participants will be assigned to a unit for further training
